This has to be my favourite traditional block to make, and because of this I need to share it. When making my blocks I chose to fussy cut my fabric, allowing me to create a surprise element within each block.

The fabric needs listed below is more than enough to get you started. As you progress with your blocks you may see a theme emerge and want to purchase more fabrics.

Key Details

- Sewing Machine Required

Needs

Supplies

- 16 fat $\frac{1}{4}$'s OR 16 .3metre cuts – a mix of plain and patterned, choose some for their interest factor that you can isolate parts of for fussy cut.

Equipment

- Sewing machine, manual and usual sewing supplies
- Rotary Cutter
- Cutting Mat
- Rulers
 - Square rulers, 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " , 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
 - Fussy cutting rulers, but only if you have one
- A flannel backed table cloth (this will allow you to lay out your completed blocks)

Scrap Quilts in a Day

In this class we will be delving into your scrap bin and using some of those fabrics you've been hoarding to use one day. We will explore different ways to use your scraps for maximum effect, using squares, rectangles and half square triangles (HST). Join in and be prepared to have a day of playing with fabric.

Key Details

- Sewing Machine Required

Needs

Supplies

- Scraps
2½" squares, leftover jelly roll strips.
- Pre-cuts – charm squares, mini charms, layer cakes.
- Lighter background fabrics, a couple of fat ¼'s will be enough to get you started, if you have larger amounts bring that along too.
- Your favourite piece of fabric you have been saving.
- Just bring what you have and we will make it work.

Equipment

- Sewing machine, manual and usual sewing supplies
- Rotary Cutter
- Cutting Mat
- Rulers
- Pencil
- Bloc loc rulers (only if you have them)

Doily Quilt

This is the ideal project to use those doily's we love collecting and that are lurking in our cupboards. The quilt is designed to fit any amount of doily's that you may have, as you can make it as big or as small as you like. The key to this quilt is to have fabrics that will not over power your doily's and ones that complement the colours in the embroidery of the doily's.

Key Details

- Sewing Machine Required

Needs

Supplies

- .3 metre cuts of fabric (Start with 6 and see if you need to add more once you get an idea of where you are going)
- . 3 metre Cream fabric or linen to tone in with your doily's. You might find that some of your doily's will have extra fabric that you can use
- 1 metre iron on fabric interfacing, I like to use Stayflex (light in weight)
- Small amount of fusible webbing, 8" square
- Selection of doily's (I have chosen to use only hand embroidered ones but this is up to you). I recommend pre-soaking and washing doily's in Varnish

Equipment

- Sewing machine, manual and usual sewing supplies.
- Rotary Cutter.
- Cutting Mat.
- Rulers, a square ruler if you have one
- Frixion pen, this is helpful for marking out your cutting line before cutting into your doily's.

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
