#### **Photo Taking Guidelines**

Guide for taking a good photo.

High quality setting – the photo can be cropped and enlarged and keep the quality.

Good natural light – natural light during the morning or evening is best.

Down at the animal's height – taken from down low usually looks best.

Good sharp focus

Take lots of photos, then you can choose the best.

A 3/4 view of the face with light from the side comes out well.

If the animal is too wriggly, get someone to hold them around the chest so a good portrait can be achieved.
